



## ANNUAL FOUR-YEAR UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE 2018-2019 SCHOOL YEAR

(For students intending to pursue a career in Business)

### 1. PURPOSE

The scholarships are awarded to encourage high school students in the State of Hawaii who intend to have a career in Business to pursue higher education at any accredited four-year college or university. Resident students already enrolled in college are also eligible.

### 2. AMOUNT & NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS

Four-year scholarships are awarded to students just entering college in increments of \$5,000 annually. Assuming that eligibility is maintained, a total of \$20,000 will be awarded over four years. Students already enrolled in college will receive awards varying in amount and duration depending on individual circumstances. The awards will cover only the remainder of the student's originally approved undergraduate program. Approximately 40 students will be attending various colleges and universities on scholarships annually. We anticipate awarding approximately ten (10) new scholarships for the 2018-2019 school year.

To maintain scholarship eligibility, the recipient must demonstrate academic progress towards his or her degree by successfully completing a full-time course load each year aid is received. The minimum grade point average (GPA) to qualify for continued aid is 3.0, except in special circumstances. Students must maintain an intent to have a career in Business and must submit an essay at the end of each school year as instructed by the Foundation. The scholarship will be discontinued if less than a full-time course load is taken, if the student changes his or her goal of obtaining a career in Business, if the student no longer attends a qualifying four-year accredited college or university, if an acceptable GPA is not maintained, or if other requirements are not met.

### 3. QUALIFICATIONS & BASIS OF SELECTION

- A. In order to be eligible to apply for an award from the Fukunaga Scholarship Foundation, students must have graduated from a public, private, or charter high school in Hawaii, or be on track to graduate at the end of the current academic year. Homeschooled students are also eligible.
- B. The applicant must impress fellow students, members of the faculty and members of the community as an individual deserving of an opportunity to begin or continue higher education and must have demonstrated personal attributes and the scholastic aptitude needed to achieve educational goals.
- C. The applicant must be interested in pursuing a career in Business and have participated in school activities and community service which demonstrate leadership and responsibility.
- D. The applicant's class standing will be considered. A cumulative grade point average (GPA) of at least 3.0 in his or her high school career is required.

- E. The applicant must show a desire and the ability to further his or her education as a means of attaining and sustaining a career in Business within the Pacific Islands region. U.S. citizenship is required. Evidence of citizenship may be requested.
- F. The applicant must be a resident of the State of Hawaii and plan to eventually return to Hawaii or the Pacific Islands region and contribute to its growth and welfare.
- G. The applicant's need for financial assistance will be considered based on financial resources available through financial aid and through his or her family's assets and income. All applicants must submit a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Student Aid Report to be considered for this award.
- H. Scholarships are awarded based on academic achievement, leadership qualities, a desire to attend college, special circumstances, financial need, and personal interviews.
- I. Scores allocated to each applicant will not be disclosed.

#### 4. APPLICATION DETAILS & DEADLINE

**All application materials must be postmarked on or before March 1, 2018**, to qualify for consideration by the Scholarship Selection Committee. Application materials submitted in person, by email, or by facsimile transmission will not be accepted. The following **must** be submitted by the postmark deadline:

- The three-page Application Form for the proper year (filled in completely and accurately and signed on the last page), with essays as required in Section III (A and B). The application and essays should be typed. Illegible applications will not be considered.
- The student's complete FAFSA Student Aid Report for 2018.
- An official school transcript, including cumulative grade point average and class standing as of the end of the first semester of the 2017-2018 year. The school may submit the transcript directly to the Foundation, or the transcript may be submitted with the application materials; however, if the transcript is not in an envelope sealed by the school, it is not official and may not be accepted. For college students, a complete official high school transcript **and** an official college transcript through the Fall 2017 semester are required.
- College entrance test scores (SAT and/or ACT), if available, or a signed statement explaining why the scores are not available. Scores may be printed off the Internet and included with the application.
- At least two letters of recommendation from the student's high school principal, teachers, counselors or professional persons in the community. Letters from relatives will not be accepted.

5. REVIEW AND INTERVIEW

After thorough review and assessment of all applications received, the Committee will select its finalists. Those candidates selected as finalists will be contacted for an interview with members of the Scholarship Selection Committee. Students scheduled for interviews will be required to submit their photographs for identification purposes prior to the interviews.

6. SELECTIONS FINAL

All selections made by the Scholarship Selection Committee are final.

7. ESTIMATED TIMETABLE

Early March	Applications are received, processed and reviewed for completeness. Completed applications are distributed to the Scholarship Selection Committee members for review and scoring.
Late March	Scores are tabulated and finalists are notified.
April	Interviews are held with finalists. Scholarship awardees are informed of their status by the end of April.
